What Your Cat Needs

After reviewing your cat's record, we found that _____ is due for the following examinations/vaccinations/lab procedures to help maintain a healthy life.

Physical Exam: This should be done at least yearly. An exam may be the most important component of an office visit because the veterinarian can examine your pet and discuss any medical problems.

Fecal Exam: Regular microscopic examination of your pet's stool provides early detection and treatment.

Feline Leukemia/FIV Test and Vaccination: Feline Leukemia and FIV are the number one disease killers of cats. Every cat's status should be known. There is no successful treatment but there is prevention.

Respiratory Virus Vaccination: Even if your cat never goes outside, this is still important because you can bring the virus home on your hands or clothing. All are highly contagious, potentially fatal viruses that are easily transmitted.

Rabies Vaccination: Required by law.

Spay/Neuter: If you could only do one procedure in your pet's life, this is the one you should get done since it has the biggest effect on your cat's health.

Bordetella Vaccination: Very important for pets that are exposed to many other animals such as at the groomers, shows or competitions. It is extremely contagious.

Heartworm Preventative: Cats can get heartworms, but often the only symptom is sudden death. Prevention is the best course of actions.

FIP Nose Drops: If you have many cats, especially if they share litter boxes, this is very important. The disease is always fatal.

Dental Care: Periodontal disease may lead to infection in the liver, kidneys and heart not to mention pain and discomfort.

Parasite Control: Flea control is so easy now with ointments you put on the back of the neck once a month. Ask us about prescription flea control.

Diet Change: A good diet not only keeps your pet's hair, teeth and immune system healthy but can also prevent bladder disease, a serious and common health problem.

Blood Profile: We recommend an annual blood work up especially on cats over 10 years of age. Early detection of disease and proper treatment and diet can lengthen and improve your pet's quality of life.
